Part I: Reading Comprehension (50 points)

FAST FASHION

I When was the last time you bought something new to wear? According to the latest fashion market reports, your answer is likely, "Not long ago." Clearly, we are living in the age of fast fashion. This means that people buy cheap clothes and wear them for a short time before they throw them away and buy new ones. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency reports that the average American throws away about 32 kilograms of clothing each year.

II The impact of millions of tons of used clothing on our environment yearly is a severe problem. More than half of used clothing is thrown into landfills. Within a few years, dangerous gases are produced. These gases contribute to air, land and water pollution. They also raise the temperature on Earth. In addition, the fashion industry uses up too much of our available water. It takes about 2,650 liters of water to produce one cotton shirt. That's enough water for a person to drink eight glasses of water per day for three and a half years.

III Original ways of dealing with tons of unwanted clothing are being developed. Re-Born Textiles, a new Israeli company in Kfar Saba, is testing an idea to save used clothing from being thrown into landfills. This idea includes three options - reuse, remake and recycle. If the clothes are in very good condition, they are sent to used-clothing shops to be sold (reuse). If the clothes are in poor condition, they are used to make other products (remake). If the clothes are in terrible condition, they are used for other industries, such as the automobile industry (recycle).

IV Workers at Re-Born Textiles believe that making people aware of the problem and taking action against throwing used clothes into landfills will create a cleaner planet for ourselves and the future of our children.
